### THERE IS A HNUGER ONLY JESUS CAN SATISFY

Dear friends, last Sunday, we reflected on the fact of Jesus feeding five thousand people with only five loaves of bread and two fish. And in excitement, the people at the end wanted to make him a king because they saw him as one who has the key to material satisfaction. But unfortunately for them, he escaped from their midst because they were unaware of his own kingship which is beyond what they had planned to confer on him. His kingdom is not only of this world but also of the one to come. His kingship is one that liberates people from not only physical/material bondage but spiritual one. However, when Jesus could not accept their planned offer of kingship, he escaped to the hillside from their midst but the people could not give up looking for him.

And in today's gospel, when they could not find him nor any of his disciples, they got into the boats in search of him to Capernaum. When they found him, they diplomatically said to him: "Rabbi, when did you come here"? And Jesus replied: "truly I say to you, you seek me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not labour for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you, for on him has God the Father set his seal" (John 6:27).

Jesus had to say this to them because He wanted to re-direct their attention and purify their intention. A good number were looking for him because of food and drink which could only give them momentary and earthly satisfaction. Jesus wanted them to look beyond that for spiritual and eternal satisfaction and that is why he said to them: "do not labour for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life" which He, the Son of Man will give. He therefore made it clear to them on further discussion that it was not Moses who gave them bread from heaven but His Father for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world. And they starting demanding for the bread saying: "Lord, give us this bread always". And Jesus was able to pass the message unto them by telling them that He, Jesus is the bread of life, and anyone who comes to him shall not hunger and anyone who believes in him shall never thirst.

Jesus is the bread of life as we have Him in the Eucharist. He wants us to partake of him in the Eucharist. And anyone who believes in him shall never hunger nor thirst. He is the only Person to give us the satisfaction we need in this life and in the life to come.

From the readings today, we have to understand that there is a physical hunger which only food can satisfy and there is a spiritual hunger which no food in the world can satisfy. You can be hungry and open your refrigerator and you see nothing to take even when your refrigerator is filled up and you can say to yourself "I am hungry but not for any of these in the refrigerator" and you are confused. Or put in another way: you have everything that is important in life —a family, job; good income or wonderful planned form of retired life yet you are not happy, you still feel something is missing in your life. It could be possible that that missing in your life could be Jesus. And he is telling us today that he is the bread of life and that anyone who comes to him shall not hunger nor thirst again. Let us seek Jesus with all our heart for there is a hunger in all of us that only Jesus can fill. Let us go to him and possess him as our own possession.



# SACRED HEART CHURCH

#### COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

The Government has decreed that from 19th July, there will be no legislation on social distancing in England. The Bishops' Conference has advised all parishes of the importance of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship. Recognition of the presence of the virus in the population means that certain preventative practices will still be required: it is essential to ensure that the Church continues to discharge its Health and Safety duties and that common sense and risk averse activities are kept in place to mitigate against the transmission of the virus which is still prevalent in society.

- Face coverings are strongly recommended to be worn by those in church.
- The church will continue to provide hand sanitiser at entrances and exits.
- The NHS Test, Track and Trace system will remain in operation to make available the means for people to sign in for acts of worship using the NHS app and the associated QR codes.
- The Parish Track & Trace Forms will remain in use for all Masses.
- The present one-way system will remain, with entry by the tower door and exit via the main doors.
- We shall still need stewards at all Masses, as a welcoming presence at the church door is a
  valuable sign of hospitality; stewards are present to ensure that the church remains a safe
  place where all may worship safely.
- The church will continue to be cleaned and disinfected after every Mass; if you would like to help please let one of the stewards know.
- Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind and the ministers will continue to sanitise
  their hands beforehand and wear a face covering whilst distributing. Communion is
  recommended to be distributed in the hand, but those who wish to receive on the tongue may
  do so.
- People should exercise good responsible behaviour, especially when moving to receive Holy Communion during Mass, and should avoid getting too close to each other. Management of Holy Communion as directed by the stewards will continue.
- At this time, the Bishop has recommended that Holy Water stoups are not refilled. Should
  people wish to receive holy water, please bring your own container and ask one of the priests,
  or one of the stewards.
- The offertory collection will not be resumed in church; please use the box at the back of church or donate online or by standing order.
- Indoor congregational singing will be permitted from 19th July. The Bishops' Conference has
  asked that singing should be phased in gently, as part of worship over the summer period, and
  that face coverings should be worn by members of the congregation whilst singing together,
  until infection levels reduce.
