EASTER: THE OTHER SIDE OF THE CALVARY

'I saw the tomb of the now living Christ,
I saw the glory of Christ, now risen.
I saw the angels who gave witness;
The clothes too which once had covered head and limbs.
'Christ, my hope has risen.
He will go before his own into Galilee'
(Culled from Sequence)

My dear friends, looking at the gospels, we can boldly say that Easter is the great day of the Lord's resurrection. It is the day when the power of darkness was overthrown by the power of light; the day the Good News of the resurrection of the Lord was announced to the world. It is a great day when the tomb of Jesus was found empty; the stone rolled out; the day the angel of the Lord was found in the tomb to give the Good News to Mary Magdalene and the Apostles that the Lord is risen and showed them the empty tomb. It can also be said to be the great day when Mary Magdalene met Jesus on her way with the news that he is alive and asked her to go and tell his brothers (the Apostles) that he will meet them in Galilee. It is a great day when Jesus broke the power of death and of the grave and walked away safely as he promised. It is a great day when Jesus fulfilled his promise to his followers that he will rise on the third day. We can go on and on and enumerate what Easter is all about because it is a wonderful day, the day the Lord had made and we rejoice and are glad.

Easter is wonderful day when we witness the other side of the Calvary story which assures us that all hope is not lost. On Good Friday, Jesus was unjustly condemned to death by the Scribes and Pharisees and the elders. He was betrayed, rejected and justice denied him. He was bitterly treated; given the crown of thorns and allowed to die through the pains of the cross. But on Easter Sunday, Christ proved his innocence. He defeated death, fulfilled his promise and walked out of the tomb untouched. The Good Friday event of betrayal, agony, abandonment and hopelessness gave way to the good news of Easter, ushering in the other side of the cavalry message.

The other side of the Calvary story is that of joy, love and happiness which we all share at Easter over the victory of Christ. It reminds me and all of us that the cross does not go without a crown. As such, we are called not lose hope, for if there is no Good Friday, there will be no Easter. Every 'Good Friday' shall come to pass and the joy of Easter will take its place. But we must not forget that as Christians, we are the resurrection people. We need faith to surmount the hurdles, the crosses of this present time to be with the Lord at the end of our lives for all things shall one day come to pass away. That is why Christians are called at a time like this to look up to their resurrection time. They are called to look intently at the cross of Christ and momentary crosses of their life and say with faith and hope: it shall one day come to pass. Those suffering loneliness, rejection, persecution and abandonment can now look intently at the risen Lord and at his or her embarrassing condition and say with confidence: it shall one day be over.

Today, the furloured and unemployed experiencing challenges at the moment can as well look intently at the risen Lord and at his or her ugly situation and say with lively hope: it shall come to pass. Today, those who are discouraged, distressed and crossed over the event of the past months of the pandemic should rise up and know that it shall one day come to pass away. Christ has risen and that is the other side of the Calvary story. Darkness does not last. It gives way to the light when it comes. God who had risen Jesus from the dead is still in charge. He did it before. He will do it again. He is the guarantee of ultimate victory. Ours will not be different especially when we put our faith, hope and trust in him. With great faith in the resurrection, every cross shall come to pass away, 'for all things work unto good for those who love God' (Rom 8:28).


Triduum and Easter Liturgies
